2. Adoption of minutes for meeting of 16 May 2006

3. POLICE REPORT: P C John Hamil is on holiday but gave a report by telephone that there have been no reported crimes in the last month. He will contact either Mrs Masterman or Mr Findlay when he restarts work re "no waiting" cones for Harbour gala Day.

4. MATTERS ARISING:

Waste Water Treatment Works: Work is in progress at site in Croft Field. Nothing further re pumping station at Seaview.

5. COUNCILLOR'S REPORT: Councillor Murray spoke to A Guthrie about large skip, which will possibly be sited in Bus Park, and Mr Guthrie will contact S McDonald from South Ayrshire Council to get this organised. This is usually left over a weekend.

Councillor Murray has written to Mr Peterkin re Secretary's payment, which is felt to be very little, and he awaits a response to his letter.

He also reported Gillian Anderson working with Kennedy Hall & Park Committee to help raise funding for disabled access.

6. FINANCIAL REPORT: The Administration Grant "top up" of £387.86 has now come through, and with a deduction of £29.38 for the Annual Audit, this makes an outstanding balance of **£567.19 at 19 June 2006.**

The Community Hall Account balance stands at **£2444.53 at 19 June 2006.**

8. ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

- Mr Guthrie advises any applications for scholarships through the Baron of Dunure should be in by 31 July 2006. Students from Dunure and the surrounding villages are eligible to apply.
- Mr Montgomerie has suggested we advertise our meetings to encourage members of the public to attend. On checking the handbook we find that members of the public may speak at an "Open Forum" and it has been agreed to add this to our Agenda.
- As we have only eight full members at the moment we will also ask if any interested party would like to be co-opted until end March 2007.
- Councillor Murray has had communication with a resident who is concerned that the trees planted in the field below the lay-by at the south of the village block the view of Arran. It was felt these trees being in such an exposed position would never grow very tall.
- Travellers were in park recently but moved on next morning. It still may be an idea to have some deterrent in the form of a "height restriction" bar. Kennedy Hall & Park Committee is looking into this.
