1. APOLOGIES:

2. Adoption of minutes for meeting of 16 January 2007.

Proposed Mr P Findlay, Seconded Mr David Broadhead.

POLICE REPORT: P C Hamil reports the theft of generator from a property in the village. This occurred during the previous week.

P C Hamil asks that residents keep all tools and garden equipment under lock and key to deter the opportunist thief.

Mr Findlay is concerned about speeding vehicles on Station Road, and P C Hamil suggests he reports this when it occurs.

4. MATTERS ARISING:

Railway Bridge above Croft: Plastic netting has now been put in place over the metal sides of the bridge as a safety measure and to make people aware of the dangerous condition. Councillor Murray advises the next step here is to ascertain the owner of the bridge.

Pumping Station at Seaview: Nothing further to report here, but a resident has suggested a meeting with the Planning Department and Scottish Water has been arranged for the near future.

Wind Farm: The meeting arranged by Mr Peter Walker was cancelled at the last minute and we were unfortunately not advised of this cancellation. This meeting will take place at a date to be arranged.

Finances: We have agreed to order a bench as soon as possible and then decide on a suitable site for this at a later date.

Ditches: The open culvert at the end of Fisherton Avenue has been cleared and also ditches all along the road that will be of benefit during any further heavy rain.

5. COUNCILLOR'S REPORT: Repairs to the road have been agreed – Castle Road and in the vicinity of Dunduff Farm.

National Trust for Scotland will be contacted re the possibility of a dog waste bin at Croy Shore.

Mrs McCreath, Secretary of Kennedy Hall & Park Committee has been in contact with Councillor Murray re a demand from South Ayrshire Council for Hall Insurance although the Committee have already paid this themselves. Councillor Murray is writing re this. We have assured Councillor Murray that it is not Kennedy Hall & Park Committee who are refusing to sign lease, but that South Ayrshire Council seem to be dragging their feet. Councillor Murray will chase this up.

The All Weather games area will go ahead and will still accommodate tennis. It is hoped this will be completed before the end of the financial year.
