2. Adoption of minutes for meeting of 21 August 2007.

POLICE REPORT: P C Hamil was not in attendance, but his report for the previous month was as follows: A Person was apprehended on two occasions for not complying with conditions imposed upon him. Three thefts reported within the area: one of a sign outside Dunduff Farm, a mini motorbike from Arran View, and theft of property.

4. MATTERS ARISING:

Flashing Lights at school: In spite of numerous complaints about the failure of the lights on the north side of the school, we have been informed they will be renewed when time and money permit.

Pumping Station at Seaview: Email from Dawn McDermott Scottish Water, who will advise us when work likely to commence.

Big Skip: Mr Guthrie still awaits hearing about this.

Civic Pride: We now have estimates for speed bumps for park and three tables for Kennedy Hall. The Christmas tree project will have to be investigated further. Mr Eaglesham thinks there may be a way to get lights to the tree (one at Port Rorie, and/or one at the bottom of Kennedy Drive). We will look into this.

Bus Park: A site visit has been help and it is hoped there will be some lines or crosshatching to determine a safe area for the buses to turn and park.

Toilets: Councillor Goldie was advised that these would indeed be closed for the winter months.

Graffiti on castle: nothing further here.

Wind Farm: Mr Montgomerie attended a meeting in Maybole with representatives from local Community councils. This was to form a steering group to determine how to allocate funding. Mr Montgomerie will represent Dunure, with another member if possible.

5. COUNCILLORS REPORT: Councillor Low will arrange for wreath for Remembrance Sunday. Mr Montgomerie confirmed this short service would take place at the cemetery at 1.00pm on 11 November. The British Legion will be in attendance.
