- 2. Adoption of minutes for meeting of 15 August 2006**
Proposed Mr R Storie, Seconded Mr A Guthrie.
- 3. POLICE REPORT:** P C John Hamil reports there have been some incidents involving boats, also theft from garden sheds in area. Reminds everyone to be vigilant and make sure sheds and garages are secure. He also mentioned a "quick spend" by Scottish Executive by October but this would be directed towards youth projects. Hub caps have been removed from cars in Kennedy Drive and P C Hamil will have a word at the school. P C Hamil hopes the new clamp down on boy racers by confiscating their cars until court appearances will help to discourage this practice.

4. MATTERS ARISING:

Waste Water Treatment Works: Dawn McDermott, Scottish Water, was under impression a site visit at the proposed pumping station, Seaview, was imminent, but this has not been confirmed yet. She states work is well ahead with main treatment works, the final part of the project being the access road which should be completed before the end of the year. Long outfall has been completed, and the site has passed all relevant checks by health and safety. Large skip: Mr Guthrie confirms this will be in from 22 to 25 September.

Co-option: Secretary confirmed to qualify person must be over 18 years of age and on the electoral roll.

5. COUNCILLOR'S REPORT: Surface at play area in Kennedy park has now been repaired. He has written a letter re speed limit on lower stretch of Station Road and this has been acknowledged. He will write again re shrubs bordering Carrick Place, and also the path between Kennedy Drive and Carrick Place (south) which is overgrown and slippery. Councillor Murray states the toilets are scheduled to be closed over the winter, but will arrange a meeting with Ms Pettigrew and Kennedy Hall & Park Committee representative. The all weather play area may still be developed to a reduced plan. Await developments here.

6. FINANCIAL REPORT: The Administration Account has a balance of
£578.12 at 11 September 2006.

The Community Hall Account balance stands at **£2449.58.**

- Mr McCrindle commented on hedge from Croft to harbour badly needing cut. We must find out who is now responsible for this as Scottish Water have taken over the adjacent field.
- Mr Kerr asks about the possibility of community Centre in Park. Confirmed this if it happened was very much in the future.

- Mr Gibson commented on the skate board area which he feels was erected in the wrong place. As this was responsibility of South Ayrshire Council, nothing now can be done about this.

- Mr Montgomerie has spoken with Dr Begg who is taking part in an initiative to get funding for a walk from Ayr to Girvan and beyond using shore/old railway line etc. Suggests we get Dr Begg to our meeting in November to discuss this with us.
- The re-cycling bins are needing replaced in park, and a bin for clothing/shoes has appeared without notifying Kennedy Hall & Park Committee. On the subject of re-cycling Mr Guthrie asked Councillor Murray if he can find out if South Ayrshire Council is indeed re-cycling all materials from blue/brown bins.
