1. APOLOGIES: Mr D Broadhead, Mr Phil Findlay, Mr R Storie.

2. Adoption of minutes for meeting of 19 September 2006

Proposed Mr A Guthrie, Seconded Mrs M Masterman.

3. POLICE REPORT: P C John Hamil reports there has been one incident of vandalism, also items stolen from tool shed/outbuildings in the vicinity and he asks that everyone remain vigilant and security conscious. P C J McGarry was in the area with the Mobile Unit and P C John Hamil has visited the school to talk of "stranger danger".

Mention was made of perhaps increased traffic on A719 to avoid the cameras on A77 but as yet no proof of any increase.

Two flares have been found on beach at Croy and dealt with in the appropriate manner.

4. MATTERS ARISING:

Waste Water Treatment Works: Councillor Murray was able to confirm no date yet for Planning site visit. Further information has been requested of Scottish Water regarding the effect on the "tombola" on the beach adjacent to the proposed site at Seaview. The main treatment works appears to be on schedule, and should be completed before the end of the year.

Large Skip: Owing to problems this did not arrive and Mr Guthrie will try and make an arrangement for a later date.

Hedge from Croft to village: This has still not been cut and we will make enquiries if this is now the responsibility of Scottish Water.

Community newsletter: Amended copy will be sent to Gillian Anderson at earliest.

Path to Cemetery: Gillian Anderson will organise a site visit with one or two of our members to consider the feasibility of this project.

Toilets: We will write to South Ayrshire Council as it seems we are the only village in South Ayrshire where the public conveniences are closed during winter months

Shrubs at Carrick Place: South Ayrshire Council will attend this to.

5. COUNCILLOR'S REPORT:

In reply to a query by Mr Guthrie previously, Councillor Murray confirms South Ayrshire is indeed recycling materials collected from households: Blue bin contents are separated at a Materials Recycling Centre at Irvine, and sold on; Brown bin contents to a centralised composting plant at Ardeer then used in landscaping works; and the glass from the black box sorted at Walker Road then transported to the glass recycling plant at Alloa. There is a CD available with this information. Still in discussion with Bob Baillie about proposal for old tennis court in park.

The condition of the War Memorial on the school wall was brought to the attention of Mrs McKinley, Head Teacher at Fisherton Primary. She contacted Councillor Murray and South Ayrshire Council will now repair this.

6. FINANCIAL REPORT: The Administration Account has a balance of
£578.12 at 11 September 2006. (no October statement)
The Community Hall Account balance stands at **£2451.25.**

- Changes to South Ayrshire Local Plan now includes part of the field adjacent to houses on Ayr Road, and also deletes the area at the end of Arran View. This may mean planning is approved for housing in this area of Fisherton.
- Mr Montgomerie has arranged with Dr Begg to attend our next meeting at 7.00pm to inform us on the coastal path project (Ayr to Girvan).
